## What is Ambient Grounds?

My goal is to expand access to electronic music education, helping people grow personally and build new connections in the community.

## What Are We Working On?

We are beginning this Ambient Grounds journey with two core programs: Sound Explorers and Hear the Earth. Both aim to accomplish our mission in unique ways.

Sound Explorers brings the power of electronic music production into a travel-friendly, mobile music recording studio. Equipped with synthesizers, keyboard controllers, speakers, and a laptop, we are able to bring electronic music education to anywhere your community gathers. Whether it's your school, local library, favorite park, or even your neighborhood, Ambient Grounds can bring the music to you. Ambient Grounds will teach the basics of synthesis, how to create your first song, and how to turn that into something you can share. It's a fantastic way to bring out emotions, find inner peace, and share the joy of music.

Hear the Earth is a program designed to get people outside and listen to the world around them. So often we rush through our days without ever stopping, taking a breath, and truly listening to the vibrations that surround us. Equipped with a field recorder (basically a portable microphone), program attendees will learn the basics of field recording while simultaneously learning how to focus attention on the sounds that otherwise never get noticed. The sound of their shoes on different surfaces, the way wind moves through trees, and the deeper sounds of nature that often go unheard. We then take those found sounds and bring them back to the recording studio and make truly unique electronic music with the recordings. Ever wanted to create a drum set entirely from the sounds of wood, rocks, and grass that you recorded yourself?

## How You Can Support

As we begin this mission, the biggest support we can get is outreach. Tell a friend, reach out to a teacher, or talk to a coworker.
